WEEKLY OVERVIEW

McDADE MONDAY

Campers will learn all about the old McDade pottery shop, founded by Robert Williams of Bastrop in 1853, and enjoy pottery-themed activities, such as mosaics, mugs, jugs and more. The town of McDade is also home to an annual watermelon festival and parade, which will occasionally serve as inspiration for arts, crafts and more.

TEXAS TUESDAY

Little explorers will time-travel through Texas days of yore while staying put among the Lost Pines of present day, learning about the history of the Lone Star State and creating miniature scrapbooks that feature the state flower, bird, tree and other well-known and much-loved symbols of Texas.

WILDERNESS WEDNESDAY

This fun-filled day will showcase our handsome setting, consisting of hikes, feeding the ducks, meeting the mascots at the Lost Pines Corral, exploring along the Lower Colorado River and learning about the flora and fauna that inhabit our scenic neck of the woods.

TONKAWA THURSDAY

Youth will learn all about the Tonkawa Indians that occupied the land on which our resort sits and whose tribal dance with wolf skins inspired the name of Wolfdancer Golf Club. Activities include VIP access to our Lost Pines teepee where campers will make pictographs from scratch materials.

SPANISH FRIDAY

Remember the Lost Pines! Your wee ones certainly will after this session inspired by Texas history, learning about the Alamo and the days when the Lone Star State was Mexican territory. Fun includes playing *loteria* (Bingo), creating *banderolas* (papercut banners) and making leather art.

SUPERSTAR SATURDAY
